PROGRAMME SUMMARY

The Education sector is identified among the priority areas of intervention related to the Syria crisis by the Regional Refugee and Resilience Plan (3RP) and by National Crisis Response Plans in Jordan and Lebanon. In line with these priorities, the programme supports the right to education of vulnerable school-aged children from both the refugee and host communities affected by the Syria crisis, by enhancing the access to quality formal and non-formal learning opportunities.

To ensure equal access to quality school services in safe and protected environments, the action focuses on school rehabilitation and outreach activities that will result in increased demand and reduced barriers to entry or re-entry into formal educational pathways.

Direct beneficiaries are children, their families and staff of the rehabilitated school facilities, while refugee and host communities, as well as municipalities and the Ministry of Education, indirectly benefit from the initiative.

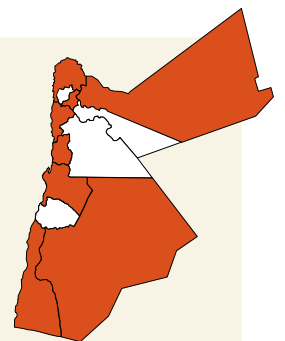

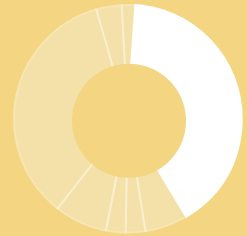
- R1 Improved school infrastructures (19) and equipment;
