PROJECT SUMMARY

This project aims at providing protection and healthcare services to the most vulnerable Syrian refugees and Jordanian host communities living in informal tented settlements (ITS) in Jordan. The Governorate of Mafraq is located in the North of Jordan, close to the border with Syria, and has a widespread presence of so-called Syrian vulnerable outreach communities, also known as informal settlements.

These communities are formed by Syrian refugees that live outside official refugee camps and are not able to afford living in urban areas, due to the high living cost. It is extimated that around 80% of Syrian refugees are living out of the official camps. The informal nature of these settlements means that access to shelter, food, vwater,

protection, sanitation, health, education, and services is limited and, in the majority of cases, absent.

Syrian refugees living in ITS in Jordan are among the most vulnerable groups within the refugee population affected

by the Syrai crisis. Moreover, many of these camps are mobile and are often not targeted by the intervention of the international community.

The two project's components, healthcare and protection, will be implemented both in informal camps and in the centre of the local CBOs that are partners in the project. A medical mobile unit composed of a gynecologist, a pediatrician and a nurse, will provide reproductive, maternal, new-born and child healthcare services to 500 Syrian refugees and vulnerable Jordanians (women, men and children). In addition, the medical staff will provide awareness sessions on sensitive topics such as reproductive health, family planning and best hygiene practices.

The project is implemented by Terre des Hommes Italy and Vento di Terra in collaboration with WarChild UK, Soldier's Families Welfare Society, Jordan Relief Organization and Child Care Charity Association.
