## **PROGRAMME SUMMARY**

The "Support to the municipalities affected by the influx of Syrian refugees in Jordan" programme aims to improve living conditions of the population in the municipalities of Syria's neighbouring Governorates, which are particularly affected by the concentration of refugees seeking shelter across the border.

The intervention aims to ensure:

- Restored health care services through the provision of medical equipment supply and/or medicines in hospitals and health centres;
- Improved education services for refugees and the most vulnerable Jordanian population in Jordan's public schools, through the acquisition of goods and restoration of school facilities;

 Increased social cohesion and environment protection, through the provision of equipment, rehabilitation of infrastructure and quality improvement of urban life in the municipal territory;

- Increased social cohesion and environment protection, through the provision of equipment, rehabilitation of infrastructure and quality improvement of urban life in the municipal territory;
- Enhanced access to health and hygiene services for Syrian refugees and the most vulnerable Jordanian population, through improved planning process of health services, as well as rehabilitation of medical infrastructure and waste management system.

Between November 2017 and November 2019 four schools were rehabilitated in Hallabat (1), Dhleil (1) and Jerash (2), and the Hallabat Health Centre was provided with medical equipment. In Jerash, the library and the children's centre at Zain Park were rehabilitated with the aim to ensure a suitable recreational environment for children and families, and contribute to the integration of Syrian refugees within the local community.


Moreover, a **Youth Center** and a **Gym** were rehabilitated and equipped in Junaid, and a **Public Market** was newly designed and built in Dhleil (Zarqa governorate). Construction works of the new Public Market began in September 2018 and ended in May 2019, and included: construction of 14 new commercial spaces of approximately 40 square metres each, installation of water tanks on the roof of the pavilion, connection to the electricity network, and connection to the municipal sewerage network.

In December 2019, the Programme Steering Committee determined to extend the validity of the MoU to June 2020 in order to enable the Ministry of Local Administration and the Municipalities to improve service delivery through the provision of additional equipment and works at the Public Market in Dhleil, as well as at Hallabat Health Centre and Junaid Youth Centre.
